Announcing the formation of the Antelope AYSO Adult League soccer program

This is the first and only league of its kind in Northern California. A pilot program established by the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO) in cooperation with the US Adult Soccer Association (USASA) to bring adult recreational soccer to Antelope, California. This new league is organized by the parents and board members of AYSO Region 884 and is recognized as the USASA Region 5042.

AYSO is one of the largest youth soccer programs in the United States and is a direct affiliate of the US Soccer Federation (USSF). The simple principle of the AYSO is based on five philosophies:

EVERYONE PLAYS - BALANCED TEAMS - POSITIVE COACHING

OPEN REGISTRATION - GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP

These philosophies will also be applied in this non-competitive, recreational adult league.

The Antelope AYSO Adult League will play their games according to the FIFA Laws of the Game and the AYSO National Rules and Regulations.

For the 2008 season, games will be played at Antelope Crossing Middle School located at Palmerson Drive and Heartland Drive in Antelope (next to Tetotom Park). The games will be played on Saturdays beginning on April 5 with the last game scheduled for June 14. No games will be scheduled over the Memorial Day weekend.

For this inaugural season, games will be played in a soccer-fest type format. Teams will be formed on the field from the players who arrive 30 minutes prior to game time and will be limited to 18 players a side. Formal teams may be formed prior to the start of the season only if there is a large number of registered players which would render the soccer-fest format unmanageable.

Tobacco, alcoholic beverages, and the use of inappropriate or offensive language is prohibited.

The Antelope AYSO purple/gold reversible jersey is the required uniform for all games. Standard safety gear (socks over shin guards) is required. Soccer cleats are not required but strongly recommended. More information, including how to purchase the necessary jersey, will be made available during our registrations in March.
